the home is rewired.

Signs of trouble in aluminum wire systems include warm-to-the-touch faceplates on outlets or switches, flickering lights, circuits that don't work, or the smell of burning plastic

at outlets or switches.

A practical approximation of wiring can be achieved by a method known as "pigtail-ing", wiring a specially selected connector and installation method to splice a short length

of solid copper wire to each aluminum wire end.

The copper wire, or pigtail, is then connected to the circuit breaker, light fixture, receptacle, switch, dishwasher, or other termination.

Our decision to pigtail the electrical circuits in all of our condominiums was a five-year process.
