### **Lakes Basin and Sherwins Area Trail Enhancement Project**

### **SHARP References of Public Outreach**

Starting in 2009 public outreach of the Sherwins Area Recreation Plan (SHARP) began. The Sherwins Area Recreation Plan is the product of a diverse coalition of volunteer citizens known as the Sherwins Working Group (SWG). Facilitated by the Center for Collaborative Policy, convened by the Mammoth Lakes Trails and Public Access Foundation (MLTPA), and with technical support from the Town of Mammoth Lakes (TOML) and the Inyo National Forest, the SWG met over a seven-month period to prepare summer and winter recreation development and management recommendations for the Sherwins area (LINK TO SHARP).

Since 2009 there have been discussion relating to SHARP in over 70 public meetings (See graph). In 2011 the Town of Mammoth Lakes Trail System Master Plan was adopted by the Town of Mammoth Lakes. The Trail System Master Plan updated the Town's 1991 Trails Plan and is the result of the Concept and Master Planning, or CAMP, process initiated by MLTPA in 2007. The adopted final draft of the TSMP includes input from close to a thousand public comments from more than 60 individual respondents to drafts of the final plan, circulated for public comment in the late summer of 2008. In the fall of 2008, and in partnership with the U.S. Forest Service (USFS) and MLTPA, the Town of Mammoth Lakes (TOML) launched an important new project: the Sherwin Area Trails Special Study, or SATSS (https://mltpa.org/images/downloads/SATSS%20020609%20Complete%20Report.pdf)
SATSS identifies options for trails within its defined study area, options for recreational uses and/or activities, and opportunities for public access between the study area and the Town's existing trail system.

Mammoth Lakes Trails System has created a meeting index dating back to 2015 including all public meetings in which SHARP/LABSS/LBSATEP was discussed. The meeting index links available agendas and minutes. This document contains information pertaining to the history and actions taken to develop trails outlined in the Trail System Master Plan and the Sherwins Area Recreation Plan. Public meetings from Mammoth Trails Committee, Mammoth Lakes Recreation Board, Mammoth Trails, Town of Mammoth Lakes Town Council, Planning and Economic Development and Town of Mammoth Lakes Planning Commission have been reviewed and compiled. Many of the meetings included presentations from the Trails Manager and updates on trail alignment, project initiation sheets and costs.

Other opportunities for public outreach came through the Trails Manager blog found on mammothtrails.org and through The Mammoth Lakes Trails System social media pages.



SPEAKING FROM THE FLOOR: Sandy Hogan said there should be a contractor report in the Project Initiation Sheets stating exactly what work had been done, not just the costs. Ms. Hogan said she felt that there was a lot of data collection work that was being duplicated and questioned how much of the budget should go to duplicative work. She said she thought MLTPA's SHARP environmental review cost of \$30,000 was high and asked who was doing the work, and wanted to see MLR take a more active role in the project. She said she would like to know where the funds were going and would like to see it go to actual trails, and tangible items. She noticed that MLTPA was listed as the lead on that project and said that she thought the entire \$30,000 for National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) went to MLTPA. Ms. Hogan said she would like to see the Town of Mammoth Lakes or Mammoth Lakes Recreation as the lead on the projects. There was discussion between Ms. Hogan, Mr. Rathje and members of the Committee. ACTION: It was moved by Committee Member Bill Sauser, and seconded by Committee Member John Mueller, with Committee Members Ted Dardzinski and Elise Howell absent, and carried by a 5-0 roll call vote to approve the Mammoth Lakes Trails System Project Initiation Sheets for FY 19/20, amended to remove the line "project lead" and let it be known the Town of Mammoth Lakes would be the project lead on each of the projects and would assign the work as necessary.

Mr. Rathje proposed that the Mammoth Lakes Trails System become the best trail maintenance team ever seen, with no litter within their municipal boundaries. He said they had worked with the District Ranger and would likely get a 1/4 mile trail built and potentially a new trailhead. Mr. Rathje said they may be able to connect the Mammoth Rock Trail Connector and the Meadow Trail Connector to create one contiguous single loop track.

Committee Member Dardzinski spoke about the maintenance being done by Mammoth Lakes Trails System staff and whether that work should be done by the Forest Service. There was discussion among members of the Committee and staff.

SPEAKING FROM THE FLOOR: Sandy Hogan thanked Mr. Rathje for the update. Ms. Hogan talked about past frustrations with regard to archaeological sites, specifically the Lakes Basin, and asked if the current issue included the entire SHARP area. She also asked if the proposed multiuse trail was going to be part of this program. There was discussion between Mr. Rathje, members of the Committee, and Ms. Hogan.

• Mammoth Lakes Basin (LABSS) and Sherwin Area Recreation Plan (SHARP) are two specific areas where work is underway to implement projects.
